

SECOND AMENDMENT

TO

AGREEMENT

This Second Amendment is entered into this 9TH day of November 2011, by and between the Broward Sheriff's Office (hereinafter referred to as "BSO") and the City of Oakland Park (hereinafter referred to as the "CITY").

WHEREAS, on or about October 20, 2010, BSO and the CITY entered into an Agreement for Polices Services; and

WHEREAS, on or about October 6, 2011, BSO and the CITY entered into a First Amendment, which authorized the City Manager to add Deputy Sheriffs to the staffing structure and sign on behalf of the CITY for any resulting modifications to Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement for Police Services and the First Amendment are hereinafter referred to as the "Agreement"; and


WHEREAS, BSO and the CITY are desirous of formally acknowledging the City Manager's staffing adjustments to date and the resulting modifications to Exhibit A; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual terms and conditions contained herein, the parties agree as follows:






SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The following Special Terms and Conditions have been agreed upon by and between the CITY and BSO:

CITY:	City of Oakland Park
EFFECTIVE DATE:	October 1, 2010
TERM:	October 1, 2010 – September 30, 2015
RENEWAL OPTION:	Renewable for one (1), five (5) year term upon the City and BSO agreeing to such renewal and the terms and conditions thereto.

Upon the addition of the Neighborhood Response Deputy, the staffing structure shall be revised as follows:</p>

- 2 Executive Officer / Lieutenants
- 7 Patrol Shift Supervisors / Deputy Sheriff Sergeants
- 60 Uniformed Patrol Officers / Deputy Sheriffs
- 2 Investigative Supervisor / Deputy Sheriff Sergeant
- 6 District Detectives
 - 1 Traffic / Motors / Deputy Sheriffs
 - 2 SET Deputy Sheriffs
 - 1 Neighborhood Response Deputy Sheriff
 - 2 School Resource Deputy
 - 1 Code Enforcement / Deputy Sheriff
 - 7 Community Service Aides
 - 2 Crime Scene Technician
 - 2 Secretaries

The CITY currently employs and manages school crossing guards and will continue to do so. The CITY will endeavor to insure that all school crossing guard positions and assignments are filled and staffed. However, in those emergency situations where coverage is needed at a school zone, BSO will provide such coverage at the request of the CITY. The CITY will reimburse BSO for the cost of coverage at the rate of pay for the BSO employee utilized, with the agreement that BSO will first attempt to provide coverage through Community Service Aides' for cost effectiveness.

~~As a result of budget reductions, five (5) Deputy Sheriff positions were eliminated from the above staffing structure. In the event grant funding is subsequently received to fund any of these positions for Fiscal Year 2011, BSO and the CITY agree that the cost to restore these eliminated Deputy Sheriff positions will be ninety nine thousand five hundred~~

	dollars (\$99,500.00) per Deputy Sheriff for Fiscal Year 2011.
MINIMUM STAFFING:	Utilizing the staffing structure set forth above, BSO will provide the CITY with a minimum of twenty-two (22) sworn personnel during a twenty-four (24) hour period.

	The cost of the Neighborhood Response deputy will be added to the above consideration at an annualized amount of up to \$139,333 for Fiscal Year 2012, which will be prorated based upon the commencement date of the Neighborhood Response Deputy.

SPECIAL DETAILS – CITY SPONSORED EVENTS	BSO shall provide security and traffic detail officers to support special event activities occurring within the CITY in accordance with BSO’s Special Details Policies and Procedures. BSO shall cooperate with the CITY and follow CITY procedures in the permitting of

The CITY agrees to authorize BSO to act as public safety representative for the CITY in permitting of special events (excluding fire/rescue matters handled by the Fire Department). Special details for which deputies must be dedicated or assigned to an event shall be worked out with the sponsoring agency. Special details for up to three (3) CITY-sponsored events, as identified in writing by the City Manager and agreed to by the District Chief, will be provided at no charge to the CITY. It is understood that there may be circumstances in which deputies assigned to patrol must be temporarily reassigned to traffic to supplement/support special event activities.</p>

<p>ADDITIONAL TERMS</p>	<p>Pursuant to the initial agreement between BSO and the CITY for law enforcement services, the CITY agreed to place Four Hundred One Thousand Four Hundred Eleven Dollars (\$401,411.00) in a separate reserve account held by CITY and designated to be used to satisfy the accrued leave obligations of the CITY to the Employees that were eligible for retirement on the Effective Date of the initial agreement and listed on Schedule 6 and 6a of such agreement. The balance in the reserve account as of August 23, 2010 is one hundred thirty nine thousand two hundred fifty two and 46/100 dollars (\$139,252.46), which shall be used consistent with the provisions set forth herein. The funds shall remain available for this purpose until exhausted. If the funds are exhausted prior to the satisfaction of all accrued leave payment obligations for the Employees listed on Schedule 6 and 6 a of the initial agreement, the CITY shall have no further obligation to pay such Employees or to place additional funds in the reserve account. BSO shall be responsible for actual payment of any accrued leave time to the Employees, the sum of which may exceed the amount on reserve. If all obligations for accrued leave time are satisfied prior to exhaustion of the funds reserved, the CITY shall retain all unused funds. The CITY shall be entitled to collect and retain any and all interest paid or due on such reserve funds, and BSO shall have no claim to such interest paid or due.</p>
