HOLLYWOOD POLICE OFFICERS RALLY FOR FAMILY OF SLAIN DEPUTY

Hollywood, Fla. – Members of the Hollywood Police Department have pledged to wear pins bearing slain BSO Sgt. Christopher Reyka’s badge number until his killer or killers are brought to justice.

“We want to show our support for our fellow officers. Even though we work for different agencies, we’re all part of the same family,” said Jeff Marano, treasurer for the Broward County Police Benevolent Association, which represents both departments.

The pins were created by a fellow deputy and are being sold to police officers across the county for five dollars. The proceeds will go directly to the Reyka family.

Reyka was gunned down behind a Walgreens drug store in Pompano Beach on August 10. Despite extensive efforts by the Broward Sheriff’s Office and other law enforcement agencies, his killer has not yet been caught. Crime Stoppers (866.493.8477) is offering a \$106,000 reward for information leading to an arrest.
